How to form a project idea, analysis of problems and needs of the target group. Building a problem and objective tree. Practice: developing a problem tree.

Module 3: Building Logic

Logical framework matrix: goals, objectives, activities, indicators, risks, and assumptions. Performance criteria. Practice: compiling a logical framework matrix.

Module 4: Grants and Subsidies

Where to find funding (state, private, international funds). How to read grant calls and choose suitable platforms. Practice: competition analysis. 2.

Module 5: Grant Application

Structure of a typical application (description, goals, budget, team). Language of applications: how to write convincingly. Common mistakes. Practice: starting to fill out an application.

Module 6: Implementation and Monitoring

Step-by-step planning (calendar plan, milestones). Budget control, monitoring, and results evaluation. Working with the team and partners. Practice: developing a monitoring system.

Module 7: Reporting and Sustainability

Final reporting (financial and substantive). Sustainability of results, scaling. Preparation for the next funding cycle.

Practice: sustainability planning.



Key Project Management Tools



Gantt Chart

A visual representation of a project's timeline: who does what and when. Helps in planning deadlines and tracking progress.



Logical Framework Matrix (LogFrame)

A structured tool describing the interrelationship between goals, objectives, results, and activities. Ideal for project justification.



WBS (Work Breakdown Structure)

A hierarchical structure that breaks down a project into tasks and subtasks. The basis for detailing, resource planning, and budget estimation.
